
## **NSEE Poster Forum Guidelines**

The 2015 conference of the National Society for Experiential Education (NSEE) provides students an opportunity to present educational experience and reflections in a poster format on: (1) Research; (2) Education abroad; (3) Service-learning and (4) Internships. The poster forum is scheduled for 10:15-11:00 am on Tuesday, October 6, during the NSEE Annual Conference on the South Terrace Foyer of the Don CeSar Resort in St Pete Beach.

## **POSTER FORUM**

The Student Poster Forum is an interactive session in which the audience will circulate among the poster displays and students will present their materials. This forum is intended to generate conversation and to stimulate interest for students, faculty sponsors, and the conference participants. Posters should be installed by 9:00 am on Tuesday morning and are to be removed by 5:00 pm. At least one of the authors must be present at the poster from 10:15-11:00 am to answer questions and engage conference participants. *Poster materials not claimed by their authors by 5:00 pm on Tuesday will be discarded.* 

## **POSTER FORMAT**



Cork poster display boards and push-pins will be provided by NSEE. The poster boards will be 4 feet high by 8 feet wide and will be identified with the poster number from the program. Posters should have a title and list of authors and their affiliations at the top in a font size readable from 3 to 5 feet away. Titles should be in all capital letters and the poster should include a copy of the abstract. The body of the poster should be self-explanatory and include an appropriate balance of text and graphics in describing the experiential learning project or activity. Graphic components

may include data tables, graphs, photographs, or diagrams and should be labeled to communicate their significance. A final component of the poster should reveal the reflections of the author on the project or experience described. The poster should contain brief headings that organize the information in a logical sequence, preferably in 3-5 vertical columns.
