ABOUT THE PRESENTER:

Maureen Drysdale is an Associate Professor, Department of Psychology, St. Jerome's University/University of Waterloo. She specializes in developmental and education psychology. Her research primarily examines school-to-work transitions and the many factors that impact learning and achievement at all educational levels. Dr. Drysdale is also the lead researcher on a large international study examining the relationship between work integrated learning and the psychological variables believed to play an important role for success in post-secondary education and the subsequent transition to the labour market. As part of her work with WatCACE, Dr. Drysdale designed a comprehensive Research Methods Workshop for individuals or organizations entering into co-op research for the first time. Dr. Drysdale has published in the Journal of Cooperative Education and Internships as well as presented her findings at cooperative education conferences. She currently sits on the Cooperative Education and Internship Association (CEIA) Board of Directors as Vice-President of Research and Surveys. Dr. Drysdale has received two awards for outstanding and distinguished research in the field of cooperative education and internships: The Ralph W. Tyler Award (CEIA) and the Dr. Graham Branton Award (CAFCE).

Jeffrey S. Coker Dean of the College, Vice President for Academic Affairs, and Professor of Biology at Westminster College (PA). Coker received the 2016 "Outstanding Leader in Experiential Education: Higher Education" Award from the NSEE for his research, practice, and consulting related to experiential learning and high-impact educational

practices. Examples of recent scholarship on experiential learning can be found in Change Magazine (47: 66-72), the Journal of Experiential Education (40: 5-23), and the Journal of General Education (65: 138-156). He previously served as director of the Elon Core Curriculum at Elon University in North Carolina.



Kimberly Pause Tucker is Director of the Center for Environmental Stewardship and an Associate Professor of Biological Science at Stevenson University just outside of Baltimore, Maryland. She teaches courses in the Biology and Environmental Science programs at SU ranging from Introductory Biology to Evolution and Phylogenetics. She holds a Ph.D. from the University of

Florida and completed her postdoctoral research at the University of South Florida College of Marine Science. National Society for Experiential Education

Regardless of the experiential learning activity, both the experience and the learning are fundamental. In the learning process and in the relationship between the learner and any facilitator(s) of learning, there is a mutual responsibility. All parties are empowered to achieve the principles which follow. Yet, at the same time, the facilitator(s) of learning are expected to take the lead in ensuring both the quality of the learning experience and of the work produced, and in supporting the learner to use the principles, which underlie the pedagogy of experiential education:

- 1. Intention
- 2 Preparedness and Planning
- 3. Authenticity
- 4. Reflection
- 5. Orientation and Training
- 6. Monitoring and Continuous Improvement
- 7. Assessment and Evaluation
- 8. Acknowledgment
